## THE NURSERY SESSION

- Staff on hand to greet you, answer quick questions and you can share important information.

CREATIVE ACTIVITIES

### Cooking








The children are given the opportunity to enjoy a cooking activity at least once a half term. Here you can see the children making biscuits and apple crumble.

### ICT


The children have the opportunity to access a wide variety of ICT equipment including chromebooks.

Our outdoor area is as important as our indoor classroom




## SMALL WORLD AND ROLE PLAY

# St. John's C. of E. Primary School Maintenance Fund

Because St. John's is a voluntary aided Church of England school, the Borough of Barnet is not responsible for the school buildings. To fund repairs and improvements to the buildings we have to make a contribution for each pupil to the London Diocesan Board for Schools. This levy provides a fund from which major repairs and improvements to the school building can be met. Major Projects: Once the board approves a building project, they generally meet 90% of the costs, leaving only 10% for St. John's to pay from its own budget.

This is a voluntary contribution but one which we desperately need to continue to maintain and improve facilities and provide a rich curriculum experience for your children.

#### HOME VISITS



- In preparation for your child starting at St John's, the Nursery staff will come and visit you and your child at home. To do this we will allocate you a time slot the half term before your child is due to start. This is just so we can introduce ourselves so we are familiar faces when your child arrives for their first Nursery session. For those who are starting in September you will find your allocated time in your information pack.
- This will also provide a chance for you to discuss any concerns and ease any worries you or your child may have about starting in Nursery. This visit will last for around twenty minutes.



# SETTLING IN PROCEDURE



- Stay with your child in the Nursery room and oversee them as they engage in activities.
- Stay in the foyer and be on hand if your child needs you.
- Leave your child when they are settled and return at a time agreed with the Nursery staff.
- Drop you child off at Nursery and return at the end of the session.

The settling in procedure is different for every child



### HEALTH MATTERS



- We need to know about any medical conditions or food allergies please email the office or call to let me know about any allergies
  asap.
- We have paediatric 1<sup>st</sup> Aid trained staff
- We will administer medication if necessary
- Text to inform us of illness before 9.30 a.m.
- Don't attend for at least 48 hours if your child has had vomiting or diarrhoea



### SESSION ALLOCATION



- Balance of age groups (younger and older)
- Please put in writing requests to change session.
- We cannot guarantee your preference will be met but we will always endeavour to meet reasonable requests if possible
- Those parents that have NOT confirmed 30 hours it needs to be done by the 1st July at the Office- there is a lot of interest but parents haven't finalised with a code.
- Don't forget you need to make a new application for a place in the Reception class during the school year that your child is 4
- Full-time attendance, 30 hour codes and paid sessions; lunch supervision payments £7 per session



# HOW CAN I PREPARE MY CHILD FOR STARTING NURSERY?



- Make sure your child is toilet trained.
- You may need to alter your child's daily routine e.g. getting up times, nap times.
- Talk about coming to Nursery.
- Socialise with other children.

#### Who are the Governors and what do they do?

As well as attending full Governing Body meetings twice a term, governors are also involved in sub-committees. There are four main ones which meet termly – Resources, Standards, Wellbeing and Spiritual Life as well as others such as Admissions, which meet annually and otherwise when necessary.
